An opportunity for students with a passion for literature to discover a range of new authors and texts, as well as explore fresh approaches to familiar works. Thematic coverage by period, combining close study with lectures on historical and cultural context, and setting major authors side-by-side with less familiar works, will help students to grasp the development of prose, verse and drama in English from the middle ages to the present day. Literary theory and criticism will play an important role in the Summer School, and students will be encouraged to examine texts in the light of competing theories of the nature and value of literature and the role of the critic.
